





Phone system Fraud update. First, we have resolved the issue at the Port, but I also learned a bit more about how this could have happened. Back in the dark ages companies issued employees phone cards to use when make long distance calls while traveling. These cards allowed calls to be made through the company's phone system and saved the company money instead of incurring standard long distance charges. This ability to relay calls through a phone system still exists, though no one uses it anymore, and this is what the hackers are exploiting.

Port staff has been working with The Dalles Marina LLC and transferring over information. This month we will be writing TDM LLC a \$10,000 check from the Marina Fund and are also developing a plan to turn over additional funds to them. This will require that the Port Commission approve a supplemental budget for the Marina Fund, and Angie and I are working on that.

The Port borrowed \$2,250,000 for the Columbia Gorge Industrial Center project from the State of Oregon. In the currently approved budget I allocated \$5M to Land Acquisition and Development in case we needed to repurchase the Google property. Since construction is well under way on that site, I would like to pay off the loan from the State (4.87% interest). To do this, the Port Commission will need to approve a supplemental budget for the Port Development Fund because I will need to reduce the Land Acquisition and Development expense and increase the Debt Service/Loan expense to pay this off. Angie and I working on this as well. I also spoke with Shawn Carroll at Columbia Bank, and he will be closing out our \$2M CD when its term is up on January 13th in anticipation of us making the payment to the State.

Our audit is done and filed. We will be scheduling a time for the audit presentation and I will get hard copies out to everyone as soon as I have received them.
